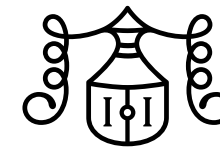

A BRIEF HISTORY OF THE COMPANY

The Worshipful Company of Distillers was founded in 1638 by Royal Charter of Charles I with powers to regulate the distilling trade initially within 21 miles of the cities of London and Westminster and then extended to 31 miles in the second Charter of 1687. The Founder of the company was an eminent physician, Sir Theodore de Mayerne.

In 1672 the Company acquired its Livery, a date which was marked throughout 2022 as the Company celebrated the 350th anniversary of this event. In 1774 the Court of Common Council passed an Act recognising and reinforcing the monopoly of the Distillers' Company in the City. This dominance was short-lived and the Company's formal role as regulator of, and spokesperson for, the industry gradually fell away as more workable legislation was put in place during the mid-18th Century.

TODAY

We are a thriving Company with more than 380 Liverymen (members) the vast majority of whom are in the distilled spirits or wine trade or in some way connected with the drinks industry. Unusually for a Livery Company of the City of London, we have 11 Corporate Freeman members representing the major Global Spirits companies. The Distillers are at the heart of the UK spirits industry championing the craft, understanding and enjoyment of distilled spirits. We have strong values of fellowship, sharing and giving back - all in the spirit of fun and enjoyment. This is most notably witnessed at the functions the Company holds in the City of London for Liverymen and their guests, most notably at Mansion House and Vintners' Hall.

We have raised our profile in the City of London with our annual City Debate, attracting senior executives, city analysts and the financial press. This year we joined the City Food and Drinks Lecture, with 600 people attending the event at Guildhall where HRH Princess Anne addressed the audience. This year we have the 10th anniversary of the Gin Guild which has over 400 producers members from around the globe.

EDUCATION AND CHARITY

Education is also a key aspect of the Company's raison d'être and, in recent years, we have formed a formal Vocational Training and Education programme. This is aimed at transforming the careers and helping the career prospects of the next generation within the distilled spirits industry. This is achieved in a variety of ways. In particular, there are scholarships and bursaries available for students with the three key education service partners that we work with – The Wine and Spirit Education Trust; Heriot-Watt University and the Institute of Brewing and Distilling. Beyond this, we offer personal mentoring and share industry experience both informally and through formal programmes. In March 2023 we launched our first impact report which shows how we work with the Youth Action fund and Inspiring Scotland, to deploy the funds we raised from our first Distillers One of One Auction.

TRANSFORMING THE LIVES OF YOUNG PEOPLE

Dear friends & supporters,

The Distillers' Charity was founded in 1955 as the philanthropic arm of the Worshipful Company of Distillers. Historically, the charity's work has focused on two important areas: Vocational Training and Education, to develop the next generation of talent in the spirits trade, and City & Livery giving that supports our mission of transforming the lives of young people.

In 2021, with the support of the Scotch Whisky industry, The Distillers' Charity established The Distillers One of One auction series of rare and collectable Scotch Whiskies with the purpose of funding work that empowers 16-to-25-year-olds in Scotland to create positive and lasting change in their lives.

The inaugural auction's outstanding success triggered the launch of the Youth Action Fund by The Distillers' Charity in January 2022 focused on changing the lives of young people who face significant barriers in reaching their potential. To ensure that we can deliver measurable and positive impact, The Distillers' Charity engaged Inspiring Scotland, a venture philanthropy organisation, to manage the Youth Action Fund, advising on the selection of charity partners, and helping ensure that our charitable funds make a profound and lasting difference with young people.

In the following pages you can read more about the impact of the Youth Action Fund, and how this collective charitable endeavour, supported by the One of One auctions, is making a difference to the lives of young people. A highlight of the last 18 months, since the inception of the Fund, is the success in providing sustainable pathways to employability for the young people engaged and helping transform their lives.

The Distillers' Charity is very grateful for the Scotch Whisky industry's support for the auction, alongside the generosity of buyers and sponsors, which collectively enables this charitable work supporting disadvantaged young people in Scotland to flourish.

We also wish to acknowledge all those, of which there are many, who have volunteered their time and talent in support of the Youth Action Fund.

I'm proud to be part of an industry that, through its charitable endeavours, is supporting young people to achieve their ambitions strengthening our communities.

The Youth Action Fund was established by The Distillers' Charity and is funded by the One of One auction. The Fund's purpose is to transform the life chances of people, aged between 16 and 25, in Scotland who are facing significant barriers to reach their potential, and empower them to create positive change in their lives and their communities.

THE NEED

Youth unemployment in Scotland, at 7.5%, is nearly double the rate for the overall working population, putting added pressure on the most disadvantaged young people who are struggling to join the world of work. Supported by Inspiring Scotland, The Distillers' Charity established early on a picture of where the greatest need exists, the barriers young people face, and where the Youth Action Fund could make a difference.

To understand the beneficiaries, Inspiring Scotland's Matrix system surveys the experience of each individual young person supported. This highlights in terms of barriers to employment that many of the young people that are unemployed face challenges with a broad range of issues. The two most prominent issues reported in the latest Matrix survey* are mental health, 42% of those supported by the Youth Action Fund cited this, while 32% felt disadvantaged by learning challenges. These issues are compounded by the two-year disruption to education caused by the Covid pandemic, which has adversely impacted on school attendance, potentially harming a young person's prospects on leaving school. In addition, over 1 in 2 of those supported by the Youth Action Fund are experiencing poverty, compared with half that proportion across Scotland as a whole.

THE FUND'S PRINCIPLES

Four key principles help guide the work of the Youth Action Fund in terms of where its support could make the most impact, including setting criteria for the charities with whom to work as well as fostering engagement with our industry.

THE YOUTH ACTION FUND KEY PRINCIPLES

- **Holistic focus on outcomes for individual young people informed by data tracking soft outcomes, progression milestones and employability outcomes.**
- **Collaboration with leading charities working together, under the management of Inspiring Scotland, offering long-term, sustained partnership with resources committed for delivery, innovation and impact.**
- **Geographic spread reflecting the working footprint of the Scotch Whisky industry and where there is greatest need.**
- **Industry engagement providing the funding support via the biennial One of One Auctions, and employment opportunities for beneficiaries.**

KEY PERFORMANCE INDICATORS

The Youth Action Fund charities track their beneficiaries' progress with a common set of measures via the Inspiring Scotland Matrix as follows:

THE CHARITY PARTNERS

Six leading charities are funded as delivery partners by The Distillers' Charity to achieve the goals of the Youth Action Fund: Aberdeen Foyer, Action for Children, FARE Scotland, Street League, ENABLE Works and the Alcohol Education Trust.

Supported by Inspiring Scotland, the charity partners aim is to make their work as impactful and sustainable as possible ensuring that young people who have most need can benefit. Working collaboratively, the Youth Action Fund's partner charities support their beneficiaries to make life changing improvements to their circumstances and achieve employability outcomes. Helping those who are hardest to reach requires patience; programmes may not succeed first time. By standing alongside each individual young person, our charity partners are ensuring that they are supported through the ups and downs of their personal development.



IMPACT TO DATE

The Fund is exceeding its target in terms of delivering successful outcomes for its beneficiaries. During the first 18 months of the Fund's activity, 603 employability outcomes were reached with the young person progressing into further education, training, volunteering, or employment from a total of 1,100 young people with whom the charity partners has worked with to date.

Of those supported by the Youth Action Fund, in terms of geography this included 28 of Scotland's 32 Local Authorities with the charities reaching some of the country's most deprived urban areas, as well as young people in need in rural communities.

The first eighteen months of the Youth Action Fund has demonstrated that, through the support offered, young people are happier, more resilient, confident, and independent, and gain qualifications to find their purpose and achieve an employability outcome. Tracking progress, soft outcomes and progression milestones (see box), which are the building blocks towards achieving an employability outcome for the young person, are carefully monitored and recorded through Inspiring Scotland's Matrix system.



John was placed into care at the age of eight and still remembers being taken away from his family.

For three years, he moved from home to home, continually switching schools which had lasting effects on his mental health, education and relationships. John finally settled at Kibble Education Centre and his youth worker referred him to Action for Children for employability support when he turned 16 years old. Thanks to the Youth Action Fund, John was able to join the charity's Intro to Care programme where, with help from his worker, he participated well and completed the programme. John now plans to become a paramedic with a place to study health and social care at college next year saying: *"I cannot believe how far I have come."*



Stephanie, 24, is from a rural part of Scotland, isolated from the opportunities in more populated areas. She struggled during lockdown after experiencing a difficult period of bereavement, and her confidence and mental health were at an all-time low when she enrolled in Street League's new Academy programme in Angus.

Despite never having had an interest in sport, Stephanie stepped out of her comfort zone to participate in every activity which improved her physical and mental wellbeing, putting her in a better headspace to start planning her future. During the programme, Stephanie undertook two work placements – one in retail and one at a luxury golf resort – which helped her decide to focus on pursuing a career in business management. She enrolled on the Business Management and Administration course at her local college in August 2022 and has already secured an unconditional offer to progress onto the Advanced Certificate later this year.

Stephanie says: *"Street League believed in me when I doubted myself and helped me get the skills I needed to succeed. I'm really grateful for the help and support they gave me."*



Once at the distillery, the barley begins the journey of its transformation into a spirit – the whole process of which happens in the building. Our distillery was designed to create an environment that would allow for sustainable production. With thanks to Borders Growers and Distillers, we are able to keep a watchful eye on the entire process, from seed to spirit.

Gordon & MacPhail

For over 125 years, Gordon & MacPhail has been driven by a simple mission: to create single malt Scotch whisky of exceptional quality.

Through four generations of family ownership, the company has matched spirit from over 100 Scottish distilleries to its own bespoke casks.

Whilst Kilchoman is a relative newcomer compared to its Islay neighbours, it has grown beyond Anthony's wildest imagination and established itself as a producer of top-quality Islay single malt.

Loch Lomond

GLEN SCOTIA

Distiller Glen Scotia has been producing single malt whisky in Campbeltown since 1832. During the illustrious Victorian era, Campbeltown stood proudly as the 'Whisky Capital of the World' with as many as 30 distilleries operating in 1835. Today Glen Scotia has withstood the test of time and is one of three surviving distilleries in Campbeltown.

The distillery still maintains much of its original design, including the fermenters, the stillroom, and the dunnage warehouse dating from the 1830s. To this day, the distillery team follows in the footsteps of their founders, using traditional methods, and carefully creating the unique Campbeltown maritime style the brand has become world-famous.

Master Distiller, Iain McAlister, born and bred in Campbeltown, has an unwavering pride for the town, its community and the deep-rooted whisky legacy it holds. With passion and dedication, he has elevated and refined production at the distillery, while preserving the craftsmanship and time-honoured traditions. Recognition of Glen Scotia's style and craftsmanship continues to be acknowledged globally.

In 2021, Glen Scotia's 25-Year-Old Single Malt whisky was awarded 'Best In Show Whisky' at the San Francisco World Spirits Competition. Over 3,800 entries across thirty-one categories were judged with Glen Scotia being awarded the overall winner across all countries and styles. Only seven months later, Glen Scotia was also named Scottish Whisky Distillery of the Year at the Scottish Whisky Awards 2021. In 2022, Glen Scotia's Victoriana won Best In Class in the Distillers' Single Malt Scotch – No Age Statement category at the San Francisco World Spirits Competition.

In 2023, Glen Scotia won 'Best Single Cask Single Malt' at the World Whiskies Awards 2023 for a single cask bottling distilled in 2009 and aged for 13 years exclusively in a first-fill bourbon barrel.

LITTLEMILL

The history of Littlemill is a captivating tale of innovation, character, and rich heritage.

In 1750, Archibald Buchanan acquired the Auchentorlie Estate, nestled a few miles west of Loch Lomond on the banks of the River Clyde from his brother Andrew.

The estate boasted a brewery, and on 2nd November 1773, according to local Justice of the Peace records from Dumbarton, an employee named 'Robert Muir of Littlemill', was granted the first-ever license by the Government of King George III to "retail ale, beer and other excisable liquors."

Following a brief closure in 1929, Littlemill was bought and reopened in 1931 by American entrepreneur and chemist Duncan Thomas. Throughout this time, Littlemill was at the forefront of innovation, boasting a unique ability to create three styles of single malts.

Littlemill distillery produced exceptional Lowland malt whisky of great character, a light and delicate traditional Littlemill Lowland whisky, and two experimental malts – the heavily peated Dumbuck and a full-bodied whisky called Dungleass, named after the nearby castle.

Using water sourced north of the Highland line in the Kilpatrick Hills, peat from Stornoway and malt from Perthshire, the Littlemill whiskies reflect a beautiful summer whisky. Their characteristics reveal gentle vanilla and floral notes on the nose, with the sweetness of honey and creamy fudge which continuing onto the palate, accompanied by classic Lowland fruit flavours.

In 1994, the distillery closed and the stills of Littlemill fell silent. In 2014, LLG acquired Littlemill, housing and maturing the remaining stocks of whisky.

Master Blender, Michael Henry joined the Loch Lomond Group in 2007 after perfecting his craft in both brewing and distilling in Belfast and Glasgow. Michael is now responsible for blending whiskies across the diverse group portfolio, giving him a unique perspective and the ability to hand-select the best casks. Michael serves as the final custodian of Littlemill, responsible for safeguarding the last of the distillery's liquid, preserving the distillery's style and character, and ensuring the legacy of this distillery lives on in each expression.

LVMH - The Glenmorangie Company

We've been crafting our single malt since 1843, when farmer William Matheson and his wife Anne followed their dreams and founded Glenmorangie Distillery on the shores of the Dornoch Firth. Our whisky makers have been dreaming up wonderful whiskies in the very same spot, ever since.

We have been pushing single malt boundaries for decades. Our whisky creators are endlessly experimental in their quest to dream up delicious whiskies for more people to enjoy. To give them the freedom to bring their most extraordinary ideas to life, we have opened the doors to a ground-breaking innovation distillery, where they can let their imaginations run wild.

Our Lighthouse was inspired by the "What if...?" approach of Dr Bill Lumsden, our Director of Whisky Creation. Spurred on by his many whisky world-firsts and wondrous limited editions, we conceived the Lighthouse as a sensory playground. Inside this building, the first of its kind, he and his team will seek to redefine every aspect of their craft and bring a kaleidoscope of delicious new flavours to Scotch whisky.

Morrison Distillers

An enduring legacy of brokering, blending, bottling and distilling the finest Scotch Whiskies. Morrison Scotch Whisky Distillers are the proud caretakers of a collection of exceptional liquid.

The company is owned and operated by Brian and Jamie Morrison, former owners of Bowmore, Auchentoshan and Glen Garioch Distilleries. Their heritage gives them access to a wide variety of unique and exceptional casks from pedigree distilleries across Scotland. In each whisky they release, they are committed to continue to impart the knowledge that has been passed down from generations of family whisky makers.

In 2017, the family returned to distilling with their new Perthshire Distillery: Aberargie. Located on the family's 300 acre farm just outside of Perth, the team checks the maturation progress regularly, patiently waiting for the best time to decant the first release from its casks.

R&B Distillers

ISLE OF RAASAY

Co-founded by Scottish entrepreneur Bill Dobbie and whisky blender and qualified botanist Alasdair Day

The Isle of Raasay (Old Norse for roe deer island) lies off the west coast of Scotland, in the Hebrides, only a short 25-minute ferry journey from Sconseron the Isle of Skye.

Roughly the same size and shape as Manhattan, but with only 161 rather than 1.6 million inhabitants, this corner of the world is known for its breathtaking natural beauty, exaggerated landscapes, impressive geology, and one of Scotland's most incredibly diverse ecosystems. With a rich history graced by the celebrated Gaelic poet, Sorley MacLean from Osaig, the spirited Calum Macleod who single-handedly built his own road over 10 years, stories of illicit stills in secret caves and Bonnie Prince Charlie's hideaway -Raasay never disappoints.

Rooted in centuries of illicit distilling, the Hebridean Isle of Raasay provides the ingredients

for the perfect dram. Illicit distilling is said to have taken place here as recently as 1850, with archaeological evidence of a collapsed still on the island. From the outset, the Isle of Raasay Distillery was never going to conform to industry norms or what is expected of a distillery –from the fusion of contemporary and traditional cultures, processes and design, to the water source, 5 day fermentation and unique six part maturation process, this is a distillery pushing boundaries for what flavourin young whisky (for now) can taste like, and how it is produced. It is incredibly rare, if not a first, in the Scotch whisky industry to not use ex-Bourbon casks for the bulk of the maturation, instead maturing their spirit between three different cask types; ex-rye casks, Chinkapin oak casks and ex-Bordeaux red wine casks.

The spirit that goes into the casks for maturation is split between being unpeated and heavily peated and married together during the vatting process to create a complex yet balanced single malt. Everywhere you look, Raasay are doing things differently, thinking outside of the expected norms. That's The Raasay Way.

We'd love to welcome you to our remote island and immerse you in our award-winning distillery (Scottish Distillery of the Year 2022 & Tourism Destination of the year 2022).

Remy Cointreau

BRUICHLADDICH DISTILLERY

Situated on the southwestern tip of Islay, Bruichladdich Distillery is home to four unique spirits; Bruichladdich, Port Charlotte and Octomore single malts, and The Botanist gin. Originally founded in 1881, closed in 1994, and resurrected in 2001, a new generation of distillers have taken a progressive approach to bring the distillery into the 21st century. Setting course to be pioneers and change makers, committed to reconnecting 'land and dram', the distillery continues to question where flavour comes from, and why agriculture ecosystems are important. This work was accredited in 2020 when Bruichladdich became the first Scotch whisky and gin distillery to become B Corp certified, recognised for using their business as a force for good.

Bruichladdich Distillery is committed to leaving a positive legacy for future generations and putting value back into the island community, with all single malts distilled, matured, and bottled exclusively on Islay. The island's largest private employer, Bruichladdich's approach to ingredients is also Islay-centric – with an average of 20 farming partners raising over 50% of the distillery's annual barley requirements within 10 miles of the stillhouse.

The distillery is reducing carbon emissions, lessening packaging and waste, and introducing greener energy solutions, with the ambition to decarbonise distillation by 2025. Committed to traceability and transparency, Bruichladdich's progressive approach to growing and buying barley has seen the distillery explore regenerative farming practices through partnerships in barley genetics and applying crop rotation systems.

Bruichladdich Distillery believes that their social, economic and environmental impact must be a positive one, and the communities on Islay and beyond will continue to be at the heart of every decision they make.

Tomatin

Tomatin Distillery has been producing and blending Single Malt Scotch Whisky since 1897; last year celebrating the distillery's 125th anniversary. We own and distribute a wide brand portfolio including our flagship brand, Tomatin Highland Single Malt, Cu Bocan Highland Single Malt Whisky and the Antiquary Blended Scotch Whisky.

Whisky production has been central to the way of life in this area most probably since the 15th century and certainly since 1897 when the first formal distillery on the site was established. The settlement of Tomatin was formed only as a result of the wealth created by the distillery. We want to ensure its legacy and well-being through the means of good environmental practice.

Fifty percent of our employees still live on site in the distillery houses, so working at Tomatin is more than just a job for our employees; it's a way of life. This in turn is reflected in the quality of whisky produced; every bottle of whisky we make is distilled with pride and respect for the environment around us.

The distilling industry, in common with other industries, impacts on the environment in many different ways, such as consumption of energy, water and other natural resources, and it is a source, both directly and indirectly, of atmospheric emissions and trade effluent. Reducing greenhouse gas emission and increasing the use of non-fossil fuels are the cornerstones of the Tomatin Distillery and Scotch Whisky Industry's efforts to make manufacturing more sustainable and support a low carbon economy.

Sustainability is key to the success of our distillery, its products and its people. We are working continuously to take new steps in improving all areas of production from grain to glass, whether that's preventing over-abstraction of our water supply, switching to biomass fuel (we were the first distiller in Scotland to do so), repurposing our by-products to generate sustainable fuels, or switching our vehicle fleet over electric and hybrid models. 99% of our packaging is recyclable, and our NPD team are always looking at ways to improve the sustainable credentials of our existing packaging.

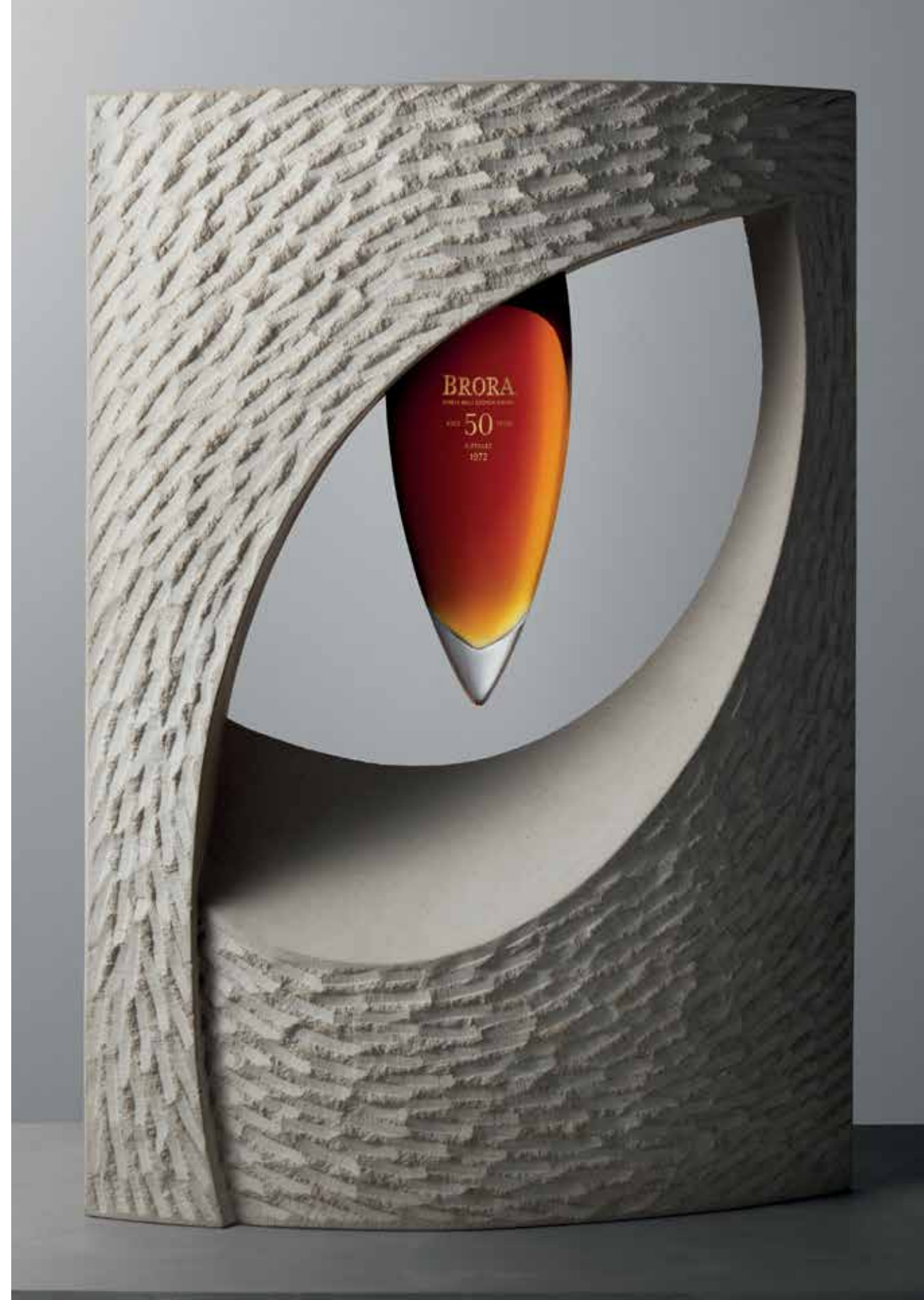

Described as "remarkable" by renowned whisky expert and award-winning writer Dave Broom, Old Pulteney Bow Wave boasts a magnificent complexity and an unrivalled coastal character. Subtle whispers of sea spray entwine with the sweetness of honey, while delicate notes of aged oak and briny whispers of maritime air tantalise the palate. With each sip, Bow Wave bares its maritime soul, concluding with a long finish which is almost as enduring as the liquid itself.

Presented upon a bed of Caithness slate, the bottle is crafted from hand-blown glass with complex Inciso cuts mirroring the essence of crashing waves. The deep blue hue of the bottle encapsulates the sea's endless depths, while glimpses of the golden liquid shine through like reflections of a morning sunrise. Surrounding the glass, beautifully crafted Scottish silverware fashioned by local Silversmith, Lucy Woodley encircles the finished vessel in all its splendour.

Four Lalique crystal decanters, each containing liquid to celebrate a century of The Glenturret's existence, contained in a handmade, Method Studio trunk.

Master Whisky Maker Bob Dalgarno has created four unique whiskies to honour each of these centuries. Details and tasting notes from Bob can be found below:

Decanter 1: 1763-1820 - Cask #341, distilled in 1986, bottled in 2023 at 36 Years Old

'A spirit style reflective of the early years of the distillery.'

Tasting Notes: Ripe Pineapple, aromatic with Cinnamon sweetness, Tropical Fruits lead with Sweet Vanilla and Wood Spices, mouth coating, maturing Oak shows later flowing through to a Creamy, Fruity finish.

Decanter 2: 1821-1880 - Cask #190001, distilled in 1978, bottled in 2023 at 44 Years Old

'Showing the growth in character as the distillery benefits from experience and learning.'

Tasting Notes: Toffee Apples and Citrus Fruits, the aromatic thread continues, touches of Toasted Oak combine with Dried Fruit, Ginger, Cinnamon and Marshmallow, leading to a



complex, warm finish.

Decanter 3: 1881-1960 - Cask #190006, distilled in 1990, bottled in 2023 at 32 Years Old

'Gaining knowledge on the influence of wood and its impact on our spirit.'

Tasting Notes: Syrup Sponge, soft sweet notes reminiscent of Sherry at Christmas, slight hints of Clove and Cinnamon. Dried Fruits and Gentle Wood Spices dance on the palate, leaving a rich but slightly dry finish.

Decanter 4: 1961-2020 - Cask #190014, distilled in 1998, bottled in 2023 at 25 Years Old

'Coming full circle, with the knowledge of time and experience, The Glenturret.'

Tasting Notes: Rich Dried Fruit, warm sweet notes from Raisins and Dates, subtle notes of mature Oak balanced with Cinnamon and Nutmeg. Liquorice and Aniseed make a brief appearance before a rich finish of Wood Spices.

To house these unique whiskies, Lalique has provided four beautiful crystal decanters using a vintage mould from the 1980s. Each decanter has a lasered image from artist Kirstin Burnet which depicts a key moment from one of the four centuries The Glenturret has been in existence.

The trunk that showcases the decanters has been hand-crafted by Method Studio in Linlithgow, the same craftspeople that created The Glenturret Uaine One of One in 2021.

The winning bidder will also receive an invite to visit The Glenturret Distillery to enjoy a sensational gastronomic experience, led by Head Chef Mark Donald at the Michelin-starred Glenturret Lalique Restaurant.

The Samhla, bottled at 44.1% abv, is the final addition, combining all three - The McClelland (1966 American Oak Hogshead), The Prior (1990 PX Sherry Butt) and The Sage (2008 American Oak Red Wine Hogshead).

Samhla means 'symbol' or 'likeness' in Scots Gaelic.

NOSE/AROMA: Notes of fresh apple and herbal tones, hints of liquorice appear with a subtle sweetness of honey.

TASTE/PALATE: Clementine orange, with the sweet viscosity of dark dates and black cherries, with a background hint of polished oak.

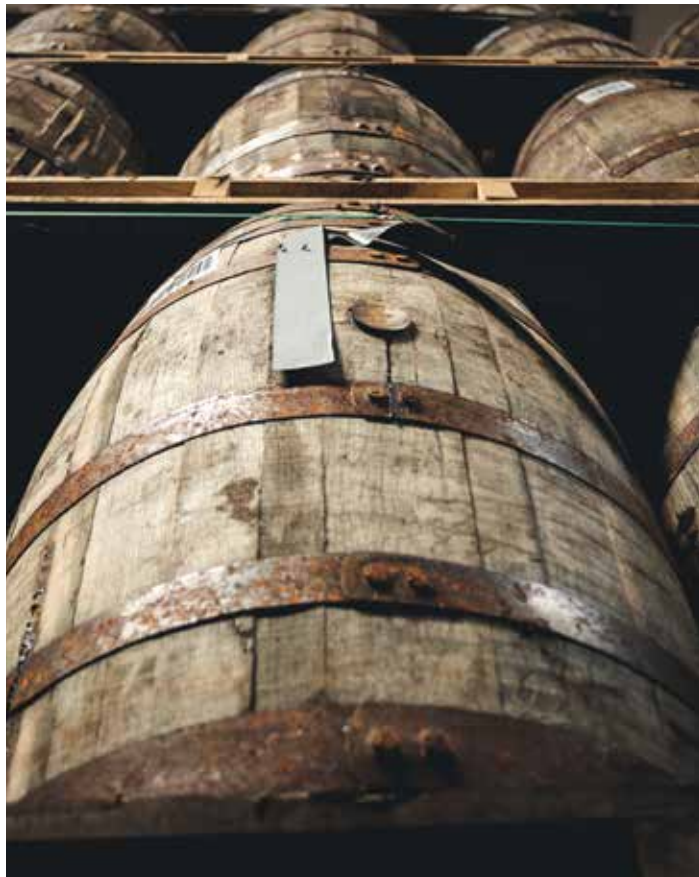

Colour - Rich golden

Nose - Rich and luxurious on the nose with layers of oaky vanilla, creamy toffee and a soft spice. With a little water, there are subtle citrus and zesty caramelised orange notes.

Taste - Silky smooth with a luxurious mouthfeel and rich vanilla sweetness. Crème brûlée, toffee apple, cinnamon, and hint of stewed fruit. The flavour evolves in the glass giving more depth a rich chocolate orange and baked apple.

The finish is exceptionally long lasting, with a lingering sweetness

Holyrood Distillery Arrival 2019 (1 BT 70cl)

Inspired by Edinburgh's rich brewing and distilling heritage, the inaugural release brings sweet and spice together, while surprising with the smoothness of a young whisky. On the palate, sweet; prominent spice; digestive biscuits followed by that juicy raisin, while finishing with vanilla, and hints of rum.

Drawing on Edinburgh's rich brewing heritage, the bespoke bottle avoids whisky cliché and leans into something a little more local, putting the already iconic Holyrood hourglass front and centre. The distinctive beer bottle silhouette and brown glass pay tribute to a once-bustling glassworks located at Baileyfield, not too far from the distillery, while the bold typography and unique shape of the label are decidedly forward-looking in their design.

It brings together a single bottle from the final three decades of this extraordinary and now lost distillery. These whiskies have been presented together for the first time, especially for the Distillers One of One auction. Each bottle is a glimpse through a window into a distinct era of the distillery's remarkable journey.

1977: Distilled on 11th October 1977, originally filled into a refill American oak hogshead, recasked mid 1990's into a similar cask. Recasked into a 1st fill oloroso on 20th October 2017. Bottled at 49.6% abv.

1984: Distilled on 26th June 1984, original filled into refill bourbon barrels, recasked into a 2nd fill oloroso hogshead on 17th May 2018. Bottled at 46.7% abv.

1990: Distilled on 4th April 1990, original filled into a combination of refill American oak hogsheads and European oak hogsheads. Recasked into a 1st fill oloroso barrel on 9th February 2015. Bottled at 48.5% abv.

Personally selected and meticulously crafted by Master Blender Michael Henry, the final custodian of Littlemill's remaining casks, each vintage has been finished for a minimum of four years in Oloroso sherry casks – the traditional choice for Littlemill, which complements its signature floral and delicate Lowland style.

The liquid is showcased in three bespoke 70cl Glencairn decanters, each handblown crystal decanter bearing three delicate cuts, in homage to three remarkable decades of whisky-making history. Housed in a one-of-a-kind handmade display, the cabinet draws its inspiration from the staves of the three casks selected by Michael himself.

Littlemill Decennia is a single opportunity to own a rare piece of Scottish whisky-making heritage before it is consigned to history once and for all.

To honour the Coronation of King Charles III, Duncan Taylor Scotch Whisky Limited released The Coronation Edition on May 5th, 2023, an exceptional trilogy of Laphroaig aged 18, 23, 26 years, each finished in sherry casks. Two sets were held back, with number one gifted to the King and Queen and the last one available in this auction.

This offering is unique from the original edition with the outer case finished in red and the labeling finished in gold. Additionally, the three decanters and certificate of authenticity are numbered '01 of 01'. Finally, the inner encasement is garnished in golden thistles.

The set is presented in a clear hexagonal case which can be illuminated by a remote control. A certificate of authenticity and handling gloves are included.

Laphroaig is the only single malt distillery to have received His Majesty's Royal Warrant bestowed in 1994. The casks of Laphroaig making up these expressions were matured in ex American oak and hand selected by Euan C. Shand, Chairman of Duncan Taylor Scotch Whisky Limited who dutifully finished each age in sherry casks.

AGED 18 YEARS:

Restrained smoke give way to gentle notes of baked green fruits. A subtle sherried texture lingers on the palate.

AGED 23 YEARS:

Eloquent notes of chocolate dipped fruits mingle with hints of smoked salty almonds. Ripe cherries round off an earthy dram.

AGED 26 YEARS:

Intriguing nuance of ginger is accented by charred sherry oak and spice. A dash of maritime air complements a subtle smokiness, softened by long ageing.

Kilchoman Cask No.1 2005

One bottle from the first cask ever filled at the Kilchoman Distillery.

In our image, we can see Jon holding a bag of Sherbet Lemons, and a Chamois Leather (classic Port Ellen tasting notes), and looking sad. Sad because his favourite distillery is done and closed (for now).

The box contains a 50ml measure of every House of Hazelwood whisky bottled to date as well as a preview to future releases behind 24 numbered advent doors. Also included is a full bottle (70cl) of a unique 51-year-old sherry cask matured blend said to be the perfect whisky to be opened and shared on Christmas Day, owing to its richly intense sherried and spiced presentation – the ideal partner for the festivities.

Wood shavings from the original casks have been infused in the sustainable paper pulp sculpture that surrounds and encases the bottle, reuniting the liquid with the casks as they once were during maturation.
